CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE: Authorizes the sharing of criminal history information on certain individuals among certain entities

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 15:587.1(K), relative to criminal history information; to provide relative to the
3 provision of information to protect children; to authorize the sharing of criminal
4 history information on certain individuals among certain agencies and governing
5 authorities; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 15:587.1(K) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

8 §587.1. Provision of information to protect children

9 * * *

10 K. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the
11 Department of Education, the Department of Children and Family Services, and any
12 recipient of criminal history information obtained pursuant to R.S. 17:15 or R.S.
13 46:51.2 may share criminal history information for any individual who is employed
14 by one agency or governing authority listed in this Subsection and who will be
15 performing a service for, or will have supervisory or disciplinary authority over
16 children of, another agency or governing authority listed in this Subsection.

Abstract: Authorizes the sharing of criminal history information on certain individuals among certain agencies and governing authorities.

Present law provides that the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information shall make available to the Dept. of Education (DOE), the Dept. of Children and Family Services (DCFS), and to the governing authority of any elementary or secondary school, the criminal history information on any individual seeking employment with the agency or governing authority.

Proposed law retains present law and authorizes the sharing of criminal history information among DOE, DCFS, and the governing authority of any elementary or secondary school, for any individual employed by one agency or governing authority who will provide a service for, or will have supervisory or disciplinary authority over children of, another agency or governing authority.
