

New law provides for the abolition of certain boards, commissions, and like entities; in some cases also abolishes the functions and responsibilities of the entity; in other cases provides that some other person or entity is responsible for the functions and responsibilities of the abolished entity, all as follows:

Advisory Council of the La. Universities Marine Consortium for Research and Education:

Existing law creates the La. Universities Marine Consortium for Research and Education to conduct research and promote education in marine sciences and marine technology, particularly where related to coastal resources and the impact of energy-related industries upon these coastal resources. Provides for an executive board to administer the affairs of the consortium.

Prior law required the executive board to create an advisory board to meet as necessary to respond to requests of the executive board for advice and information as well as to provide the executive board with the benefit of perspectives represented on the council. New law repeals prior law.

Council of 100: Prior law placed this entity (which was previously created by executive order in 1978) within the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism. New law repeals prior law.

Executive Committee of the La. Systemic Initiatives Program Council: Existing law creates La. Systemic Initiatives Program for the improvement of the quality of science and mathematics education through a committed and cooperative effort among agencies involved in higher education, elementary and secondary education, and the National Science Foundation. Provides for the La. Systemic Initiatives Program Council to administer the program.

Prior law required the council to establish an executive committee to act for the council in its absence, subject to certain restrictions. New law repeals prior law.

Governor's State Manpower Services Council: Prior law placed this entity (which was previously created by executive order in 1976) within the La. Workforce Commission. New law repeals prior law.

La. Higher Education Executive Advisory Committee: Prior law created the committee to consider matters relating to education and to make recommendations to the Board of Regents as the committee deems necessary. Required the committee to submit a list of nominees for selection of a higher education faculty member for the economic, demographic, and revenue estimating conferences. New law abolishes the committee and provides that the Board of Regents submit the list of nominees required by existing law. Relative to the nominees for the revenue estimating conference, requires the Board of Regents to consult with the La. Assoc. of Independent Colleges and Universities.

La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame Advisory Board: Existing law creates the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame under the jurisdiction of the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism.

Prior law created an advisory board to provide for the governance and operation of the museum and to advise the lieutenant governor on all matters relating to the operations of the museum. New law repeals prior law.

Ozarks Regional Commission: Prior law recognized the commission as created by executive order in 1972 and transferred its duties, staff, facilities, and programs to the office of the governor. New law repeals prior law.

Postsecondary Education Review Commission: Prior law created the commission to review postsecondary education and report to the Board of Regents prior to the 2010 R.S. Provided for the termination of the commission on Aug. 1, 2010. New law removes provisions for the commission and its functions from the statutes.

New law removes references (Title 36—Organization of the Executive Branch of State Government) to the following previously abolished entities:

Board of Directors for the La. Infrastructure Bank

Board of Directors for Regional Education Service Centers

Minority Health Professions Education Foundation
